




Kikuji Kawada's Remote Past a Memoir: 1951-1966 was published in conjunction with the third daikanyama photo fair. This photobook is composed of Kawada's early works from 1951 to 1956 when Kawada established his own style as a photographer. From the works used as the main visual for this year's daikanyama photo fair, which is highly regarded by Ihei Kimura and Ken Domon at the monthly contest of camera magazine and serves as a starting point of Kawada's professional career, to the unpublished works, this photobook presents the Kawada's distinguished images of turbulent period.
